This 20th century fort is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, offering a unique glimpse into Qatar's history. A pristine example of a typical Arab fort, its one-meter-thick walls warded off invaders and helped keep rooms cool during the hot summer. Across the desert



The undulating sand dunes of Qatar's desert have a stark beauty, and are a popular destination for a recreational safari. In days gone by, Bedouin tribes would move across the desert, setting up camp while grazing their animals and engaging in trade.

Today, this tradition is embedded in Qatari culture, with the annual winter camping season or Al Enna, where locals venture to the desert in elaborate camps, returning to the land.





Wander in wonder


The 'Inland Sea' or Khor Al Adaid, a UNESCO recognized site, lies to the south of the city, and is one of the few places in the world where the sea encroaches into the desert. For a truly authentic experience, nothing beats a camel ride over the soft sands, before embarking on an exhilarating safari to Khor Al Adaid, accessible only by 4x4 vehicles.

1/2 cup Tomatoes, roughly chopped

1/4 cup Chopped parsley

1 tablespoon Grated garlic

1 tablespoon Grated ginger

2 Green hot peppers

4 tablespoons Qatari bazaar (spice mix)

1/4 cup Vegetable Oil

1 cup Coriander seeds

1/2 cup Black lemon ground

1/2 cup Ginger powder

1/2 cup Cinnamon powder

1/2 cup Turmeric powder

1/2 cup Ground black pepper

1 tablespoon Ground saffron

A recipe for Machboos

RECIPE


- Prepare your ingredients: Chop the onion, combine ginger, garlic and hot peppers in one bowl
- Wash rice before soaking in water for an hour
- 3. Heat the oil in a large pot over medium-high flame and add correct spice, Qatari Bazaar, garlic, ginger, tomatoes, green pepper, lemon, salt and leave until the mixture blends and withers completely
- 4. Cut chicken in half and add into the pot until the mixture has turned the chicken red on both sides
- 5. Add 3 cups of boiling water and reduce the heat to low, cover and simmer for 40 minutes
- 6. Remove the chicken from the water, put it in an oven tray and cook on 190 °C / 170 Fan / 375°F for 10 minutes
- 7. Remove half of the water from the pot before adding rice and leave it on a low boil for 10 minutes until rice is cooked and has absorbed the liquid. Stir every 5 minutes
- 8. Transfer the chicken and rice to a serving dish

Qatari Bazaar

- Roast cumin and coriander until brown
- 2. Grind and mix well with the remaining ingredients until all spices are blended
- 3. Remove from grinder into a container






Qatar Airways is the national airline of the State of Qatar and one of the aviation industry's biggest success stories. It began in 1994, when the airline was just a small regional carrier

Getting around

Public transport

Those who prefer independence and flexibility can easily move around the country using the accessible and affordable public transport system.

Bus Services

The bus network connects Hamad International Airport (HIA) to various destinations across the city, offering a convenient transport option. Bus fares can only be paid with a 'Karwa Smartcard', available at HIA help desks. You can find those near baggage claim belts 5 & 6.

Taxis

Karwa taxis offer a convenient, cheap and flexible way to travel to, and from, Hamad International Airport. Uber and Careem are also available at the taxi pavilion. This is located to the left of the arrivals hall. All taxis are metered and the minimum flag down fare at the airport starts at QAR 25 (USD 7). While some taxis take credit cards, make sure to bring Qatari Riyal. Drives to the city centre should take around 30 minutes.

Car rental / Driving


There are many local and international car hire firms operating in Qatar. Avis, Budget, Europear and Hertz can be visited at HIA.

Doha metro

The state-of-the art Doha Metro is largely operational, connecting various points of interest across the capital. Currently, most metro travel is underground. However, a new tram system is under development and expected to open soon.

Best-in-class automated rail network


The Doha Metro boasts some of the fastest driverless trains in the world. Three lines, Red, Green and Gold, cover 37 stations across 76 km. All lines meet at the centrally located Msheireb Station, close to Doha's main cultural attractions. It also connects with the Doha Mshreib tram, Education City tram, and soon the Lusail tram.





It's (almost) always sunny in Qatar

A peninsula jutting into the Arabian Gulf, Qatar has two main seasons. While summers can be scorching, winters are mild and glorious. Yearround sunshine lets you get your daily dose of vitamin D, with infrequent rainfall. Summer temperatures average 36°C and sometimes reach

up to 50°C. If you're here in the summer, dress appropriately with loose breathable fabrics. Even when the weather cools, the days are warmer thanks to the constant sunshine. But remember, temperatures can drop considerably in the evenings.

A

Attire

Attitudes towards dress codes are relaxed, but visitors (men as well as women) are expected to show respect for the local culture by avoiding excessively revealing clothing in public. It's generally recommended for men and women to ensure their shoulders and knees are covered.

Bargaining

This is widely expected at Souq Waqif and other traditional markets.

C

Currency

The Qatari Riyal is the only currency used in the country and can be obtained through ATMs which are widely available in malls, hotels and around Doha. The Qatari Riyal (QR) is pegged against the US Dollar at QAR 3.64.

Currency Import Regulations

When bringing local currency (Qatar Riyal-QAR) and all other foreign currencies, amounts equal to, or higher than, QAR 50,000 must be declared on arrival. This includes jewellery, stones or precious metals valued at QAR 50,000 or higher.

Disabled Access

- 1. The Accessible Qatar smartphone app provides information about accessibility and facilities at different public and touristic venues across the country.
- 2. Ooredoo Qatar has partnered with Wheel the World to offer accessible tourist experiences to differently-abled visitors.
- 3. In case of emergency, the following specialised services are accessible for the deaf:
 - Call 992 using the 3G camera on your computer or cell phone
 - Send an SMS to 992 clearly stating your problem and what service you need (ambulance, fire rescue, police), as well as your name, address, and any details
 - Send an e-mail to 992@moi.gov.qa (Note: it may take some time before you receive a response)

Drinking Water

The World Health Organization estimates that 99% of Qatar has access to drinkable tap water. However, bottled water is widely consumed in Qatar with plenty of local and imported brands widely available.

E

Electric Supply

The standard voltage is 240 V and the frequency is 50 Hz. Plug points are the same as in the UK. To use electric appliances made for the range of 100 V - 127 V (as is in the US, Canada and most South American countries), one needs a voltage converter or a combined power plug adapter/voltage converter.

Embassies & Consulates

Doha is home to over 100 foreign embassies and a consulate. These are open for business from Sunday to Thursday and closed on Friday and Saturday, as well as all public holidays of both Qatar and the embassy's home country.

F

Friday Timings

All business and commercial activity shuts down during Friday prayers in the morning (around 10 am -12 pm). Several shops remain closed on Fridays while malls open in the afternoon on Fridays.



Greetings

Qatari ladies will not shake hands with men, and many men will not shake a lady's hand as a gesture of respect.

H

Healthcare Facilities

In case of an emergency, visitors can go to Hamad General Hospital's network of hospitals and healthcare centres.

I

Internet Connectivity

Qatar is the world's first country to introduce a commercial 5G network. Free Wi-Fi facilities are available at the Hamad International Airport and most public places including shopping malls, restaurants and parks.

Islamic Holidays

Eid Al Fitr marks the end of Ramadan, the month-long period of fasting. It's spent with family and friends, feasting for three days. Shops and private businesses may reopen after just one or two days.

The Hajj pilgrimage ends with Eid Al Adha, also known as the "feast of sacrifice", and continues for four days.

Travel Tips

Language

Home to around a hundred nationalities, Qatar is a melting pot of cultures with numerous languages being spoken. Being an Arab country, the official language is Arabic, but English is commonly used in public places.

Meet & Greet Services

Passengers arriving, departing or transiting through Hamad International Airport can use Al Maha personalised Meet & Greet Services.

Official holidays

Qatar National Day is celebrated on the 18th of December. Sports Day is also a national holiday celebrated on the second Tuesday of February each year. In addition to these two holidays, the country is closed for three days during Eid al Fitr and Eid al Adha.

Public Display of Affection

As in all Middle Eastern countries, showing overt affection and intimacy in public is frowned upon.

Ramadan

During the Islamic month of Ramadan, visitors are expected to refrain from eating, drinking and smoking in public places during the daylight hours out of respect to those who are fasting. Hotels continue to cater to guests by opening restaurants that are out of the public's view.

Religion

Qatar is a Muslim country and Islam plays an integral role in daily life. Prayers take place five times per day: at dawn (Fajr), around midday (Duhr), in mid-afternoon (A'asr), at sunset (Maghrib) and about two hours after sunset ('Esha). The exact timing varies each day according to the sun's position.

Safety

Qatar has been ranked #1 in terms of safety and security, according to the Numbeo Crime Index 2020, the world's largest database of user-contributed data on cities and countries.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in all public spaces including museums, sports clubs, shopping malls and restaurants.

Stopover

Passengers transiting through Doha can take advantage of Qatar's unmatched stopover program to explore the destination. The +Qatar program offers great deals at 4- and 5-star hotels.

Tipping

Most hospitality outlets in Qatar include a service charge in the bill. However, a tip of 10-15% as a gesture of satisfaction is appreciated. It is advisable to carry cash for tipping.

Time Zone

GMT + 3

Traffic

Qatar drives on the right-hand side of the road.

Weather

Qatar has a desert climate with year-round sunshine, extreme temperatures during summer and mild winters. Average monthly temperatures range from 17°C in January to 36°C in July, sometimes reaching highs of 40°C+ during the summer months.

Year of Culture

Conceived in 2012, The Year of Culture is an initiative by Qatar museums. Taking place with another country, the year-long cultural exchange programme invites people to explore a new culture through a variety of exhibitions, festivals, competitions and events.
