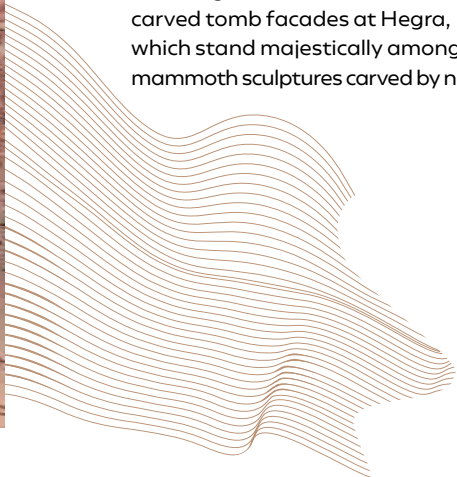






COME DISCOVER A LAND OF LEGEND

An open-air museum the size of a country (22,561 km²), AlUla is certain to take your breath away. Located in northwest Saudi Arabia, on the original incense road and pilgrimage route to Makkah, this historical land is steeped in the immense beauty of the natural world, alongside the dramatic splendour of human creations. An ancient oasis in a desert valley, the site was a hub of trade and cultural exchange for millennia, and still bears witness to those who passed through. Golden sand stretches to the horizon, and rocky outcrops emerge from the desert's expanse. Thousands of tombs and burial places can be found in AlUla, including more than 100 intricately carved tomb facades at Hegra, which stand majestically among mammoth sculptures carved by nature.

VISIT AN OPEN-AIR MUSEUM IN THE HEART OF THE DESERT

Alula's sites tell of ancient times, when civilisations flourished in its lush oases. A trading route hub, it was criss-crossed by caravans loaded with incense, spices, beads, glazed ceramics and more, its mountains echoing with the music of different tongues. Hegra, a UNESCO World Heritage site, was the Nabataean Kingdom's principal southern city, where the elite buried their dead in elaborate cliffside

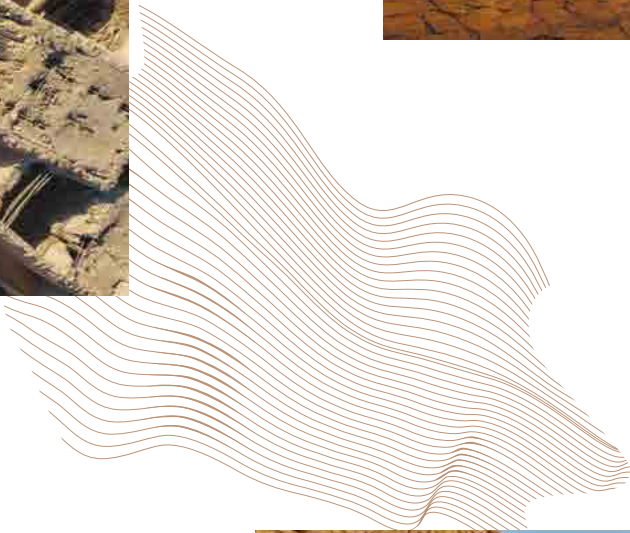
tombs. Important information is being discovered about water management and agriculture practices from the ancient city of Dadan, in new, ongoing excavations. At Jabal Ikmah, you will find hundreds of ancient written inscriptions describing pilgrimages, rituals and offerings. Alula overflows with archaeological riches, and more are discovered every day.



The ancient walled city of AIUla (Old Town) was at the crossroad of civilisations from around the 12th century CE.



The winding streets of Old Town AIUla are tightly packed with hundreds of mud-brick houses.



With hundreds of etched and relief inscriptions from the Dadanite and Lihyanite periods, Jabal Ikmah is like an open-air library.



Elephant Rock is one of AlUla's most beloved landmarks, a sandstone monolith shaped by nature to resemble a pachyderm three storeys high.



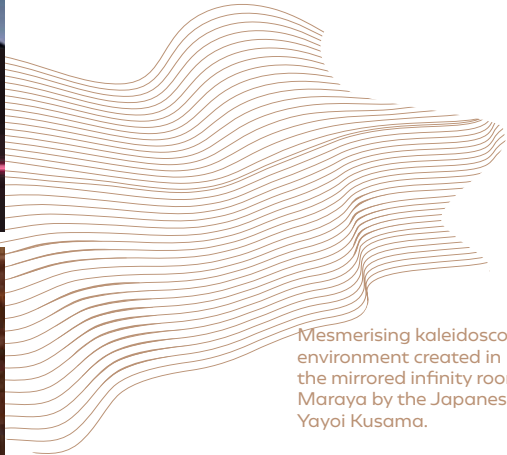




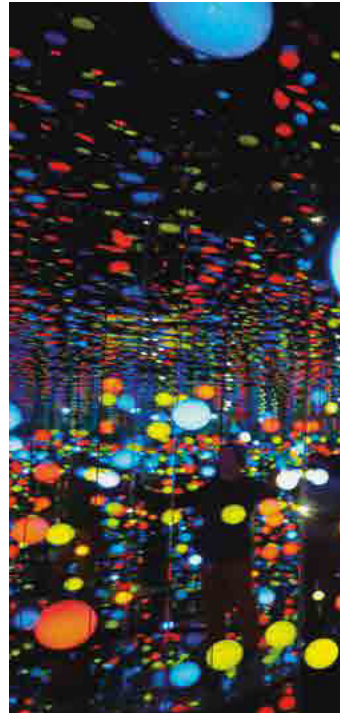
During “Desert X AlUla”, contemporary artists from around the world took inspiration from the unique landscape to create site-specific installations.

MAKE TRACKS TO A UNIQUE DESTINATION FOR CULTURE AND EVENTS

Since its inception in 2018, Winter at Tantora has wowed the arts world, featuring the best in art, music, culture and history, against the awe-inspiring backdrop of AIUla's desert scenery. Attendees relived the 3,000-year history of Hegra and Dadan through unique experiences including storytelling through immersive technology. At "Desert X AIUla", guests were

witness to AIUla's first contemporary art exhibition, which included monumental art installations that played off the sculptural surroundings. At the stunning Maraya, a building wrapped in shimmering mirrors to simulate a dazzling desert mirage, concert-goers enjoyed seeing some of the world's legendary stars perform live.



An architectural marvel, Maraya is a multipurpose 500-seat events venue and concert hall, wrapped in nearly 10,000 m² of mirrors to reflect its surroundings.





EXPLORE A REGION OF ASTONISHING NATURAL BEAUTY

Enter a desert that stretches as far as the eye can see. Marvel at ochre-streaked sandstone canyons and lunar plateaus of black volcanic stone. Massive rocks rise from out of the sand, chiselled by the wind into works of art such as the now-iconic Elephant Rock, benevolently watching over her desert home. Amidst this wild and enigmatic landscape, ostriches, camels,

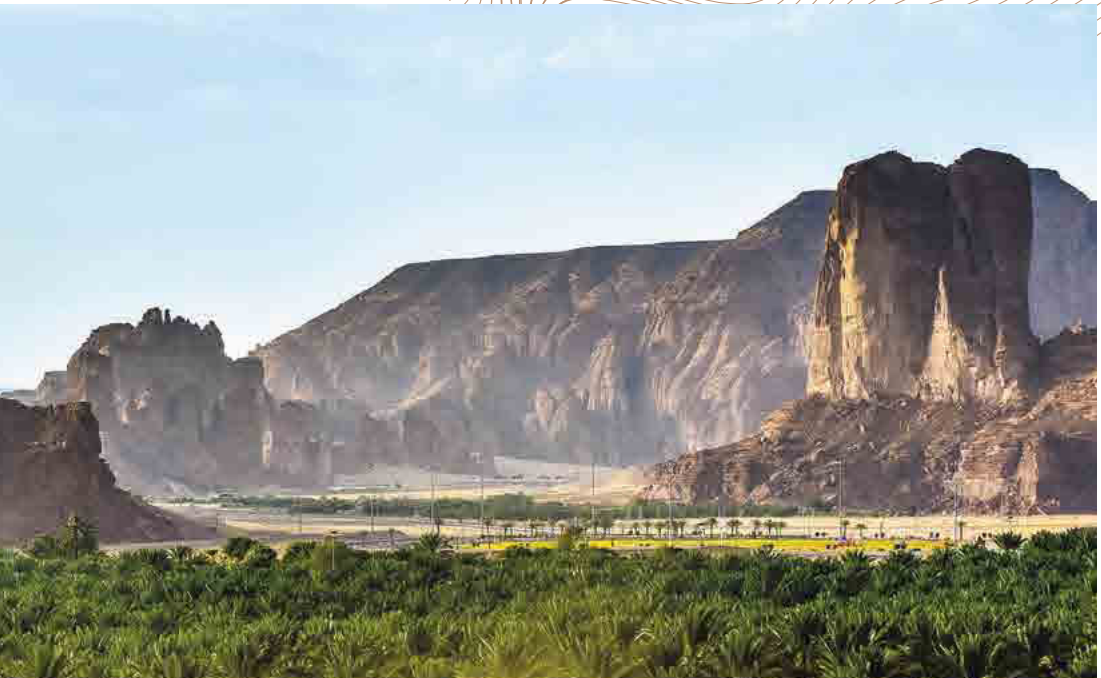
gazelles and more exotic flora and fauna thrive. A lush oasis also thrives, green canopies of a palm grove offer coolness and shelter, and the air is perfumed with the scent of dates, orange, and mint. This oasis is the heart of AlUla, and has nourished life here for millennia, inviting people to settle here and develop their rich and varied cultures.

For a closer look, tour the site by foot, bicycle, camel or 4x4. During the Winter at Tantora festival, equestrian aficionados might

cross the drifting sands on an Arabian horse, watch a desert polo tournament, or cheer on the riders navigating the 120 km Fursan Endurance Race. For thrill-seekers, a zip line is the most exciting way to cross the Harrat mountains. With AIUla's easy access to the Red Sea, many on-water activities are on offer from luxury yachts to adrenalin sports.
